งานชิ้นนี้เสนอข้อมูลเกี่ยวกับประเทศไทยโดยสังเขป 11 ด้าน ได้แก่ **1) ภูมิศาสตร์ (Geography) 2) ประวัติศาสตร์ (History) 3) การเมืองการปกครอง (Politics and Government) 4) เศรษฐกิจ (Economics) 5) ประชากร (Demographics) 6) วัฒนธรรม (Culture) 7) ค่านิยม (Values) 8) คนไทย และสื่อที่คุณอาจรู้จัก (Thai people and other popularity that you may know) 9) ความเข้าใจผิดเกี่ยวกับประเทศไทย (Misconceptions) 10) บทบาทของไทยในเวทีโลก (Thailand's role on the Global Stage) และ 11) การจัดอันดับที่เกี่ยวข้องกับประเทศไทย (Rankings related to Thailand)**

ASEAN Member Countries: Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Timor-Leste (2025) and Vietnam.



Founding Member

Thailand is one of the five founding members of ASEAN, established in 1967 through the Bangkok Declaration.



Key Contributor

Thailand has been a key contributor to ASEAN's evolution from political cooperation to economic and sustainable development.



Economic Importance

ASEAN is Thailand's largest export market, and the bloc remains a pillar of Thai foreign policy.

Thailand's Role in ASEAN Cooperation

Political and Security Cooperation

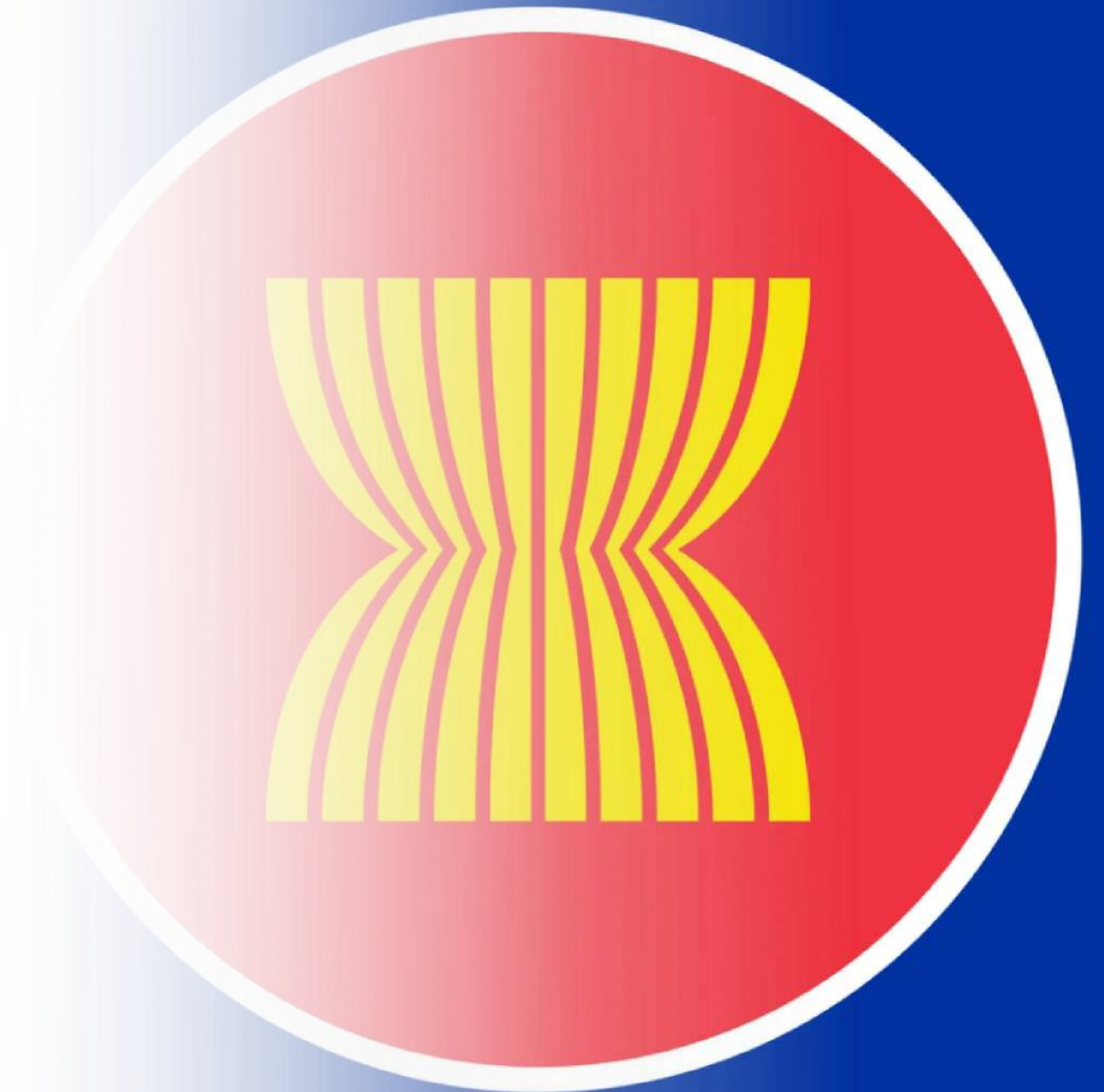
- Active in peace-building through mechanisms like TAC, ADMM, ARF, and preventive diplomacy.
- Promoted the establishment of the ASEAN Intergovernmental Commission on Human Rights (AICHR) in 2009.

Economic Integration

- Thailand advocates for regional economic integration, supporting AFTA and RCEP to enhance ASEAN's competitiveness and contribute to global economic growth.
- Proposed enhanced ASEAN connectivity, covering physical, institutional, and people-to-people aspects.

Socio-Cultural Cooperation

- Supports a people-centered ASEAN Community.
- Initiated engagement with ASEAN Inter-Parliamentary Assembly (AIPA), civil society organizations (CSOs), and youth to promote involvement in community-building.

Thailand in BIMSTEC and ACD



BIMSTEC

Thailand initiated BIST-EC in 1997, later renamed BIMSTEC. This forum connects 1.5 billion people across South and Southeast Asia.

- Members include Thailand, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Myanmar, Nepal and Sri Lanka.
- Thailand leads in 14 cooperation sectors including trade and tourism.
- Thailand has served as the host on two occasions, specifically the 1st Summit in 2004 and the 6th Summit in 2025.



ACD

Thailand founded the Asia Cooperation Dialogue in 2002, creating the first pan-Asian forum.

- Member countries such as China, Japan, India, South Korea and Indonesia and others.
- Thailand leads the Inclusive and Sustainable Development pillar

ACMECS and APEC



ACMECS

- Thailand co-founded ACMECS in 2003 with Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, and Vietnam.
- Strengthens cooperation with Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, and Vietnam.
- Focuses on economic development and regional stability.



Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation

APEC

- Thailand is a founding member of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC), established in 1989.
- Members economies such as United States, China, Russia, Japan and Australia
- Introduced the Bangkok Goals on Bio-Circular-Green (BCG) Economy in 2022, emphasizing sustainable growth and environmental resilience.

Thailand and the United Nations

1

Joining the UN

Thailand joined in 1946, shortly after the UN's founding in 1945.

2

Cultural Diplomacy and Education

Promotes cultural preservation and education through UNESCO.

Several Thai landmarks, such as Ayutthaya and Sukhothai, are UNESCO World Heritage Sites.

3

Peacekeeping Missions

Contributed personnel to UN peacekeeping operations in South Sudan, Timor-Leste and more.

Thai peacekeepers are recognized for their professionalism and dedication to maintaining global peace.

UNESCO Thailand's Properties inscribed on the World Heritage List

Thailand has **eight properties** officially inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List. This includes **five cultural sites** and **three natural sites**, showcasing the country's rich historical legacy and unique ecological diversity.

Cultural Sites

1. Historic Town of Sukhothai and Associated Historic Towns

- The capital of the first Kingdom of Siam in the 13th and 14th centuries.
- It has a number of fine monuments, illustrating the beginnings of Thai architecture.
- Inscribed as a **UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1991.**

Cultural Sites

2. Historic City of Ayutthaya

- Became the second Siamese capital after Sukhothai.
- Its remains, characterized by the prang (reliquary towers) and gigantic monasteries, give an idea of its past splendour.
- Inscribed as a **UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1991.**

Cultural Sites

3. Ban Chiang Archaeological Site (Udon Thani)

- The most important prehistoric settlement discovered in South-East Asia.
- Presents the earliest evidence of farming in the region and of the manufacture and use of metals.
- Inscribed as a **UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1992.**

4. Si Thep Historical Park (Phetchabun)

- The most important prehistoric settlement discovered in South-East Asia.
- Presents the earliest evidence of farming in the region and of the manufacture and use of metals.
- Inscribed as a **UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1992.**

Cultural Sites

5. Phu Phra Bat (Udon Thani)

- The most important prehistoric settlement discovered in South-East Asia.
- Presents the earliest evidence of farming in the region and of the manufacture and use of metals.
- Inscribed as a **UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1992.**

Natural Sites

1. Thungyai-Huai Kha Khaeng Wildlife Sanctuaries

- Contain examples of almost all the forest types of continental South-East Asia.
- Home to a diverse array of animals, 77% of the large mammals, 50% of the large birds and 33% of the land vertebrates
- Inscribed as a **UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1991.**

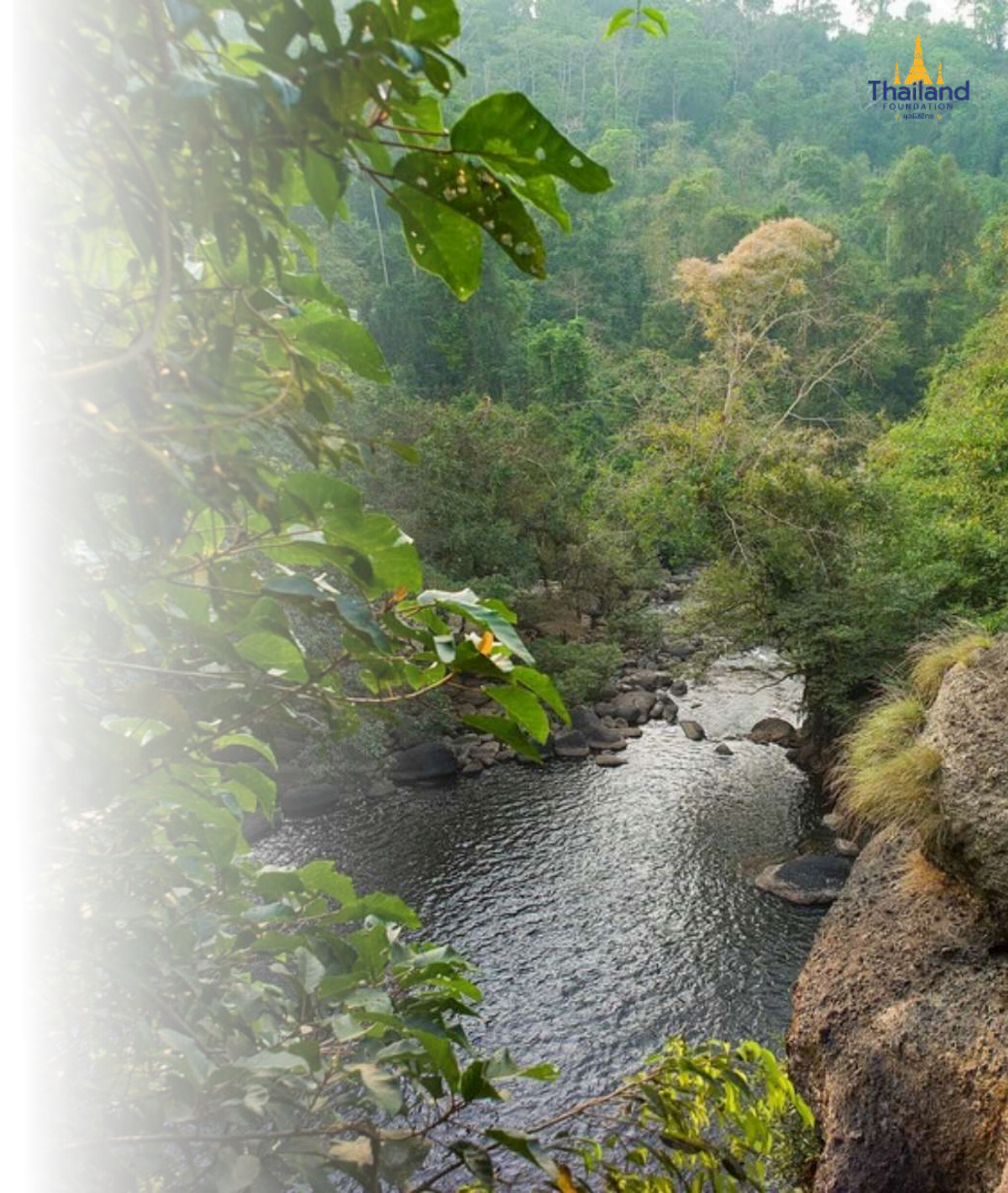


Natural Sites

2. Dong Phrayayen-Khao Yai Forest Complex

- Home to more than 800 species of fauna, including 112 mammal species (among them two species of gibbon), 392 bird species and 200 reptile and amphibian species.
- Inscribed as a **UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2005.**

Natural Sites

3. Kaeng Krachan Forest Complex

- Home to rich diversity.
- Dominated by semi-evergreen/dry evergreen and moist evergreen forest with some mixed deciduous forest, montane forest, and deciduous dipterocarp forest.
- Inscribed as a **UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2021.**

Nakhon Ratchasima world's 4th city declared "Triple Crown" by UNESCO

The UNESCO Triple Crown in Nakhon Ratchasima includes:

- **World Heritage Site:** *Khao Yai National Park* (part of the Dong Phrayayen-Khao Yai Forest Complex), famous for its biodiversity and lush tropical forests.
- **Biosphere Reserve:** *Sakaerat Biosphere Reserve* located in the Pak Thong Chai District, a hub for ecological research and forest conservation.
- **Global Geopark:** *Khorat Geopark*, recognized for its ancient fossils (such as ancient elephants) and unique geological landscapes spanning across five districts.

Thailand's Integration of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)

Thailand and UN Country Team signed the Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework 2022-2026.

- **National Integration:** SDGs are embedded within Thailand's 20-year National Strategy and 5-year Economic Plans.
- **Priority Areas:** Focus on poverty reduction, quality education, gender equality, and environmental sustainability.



Thailand's Climate Commitments

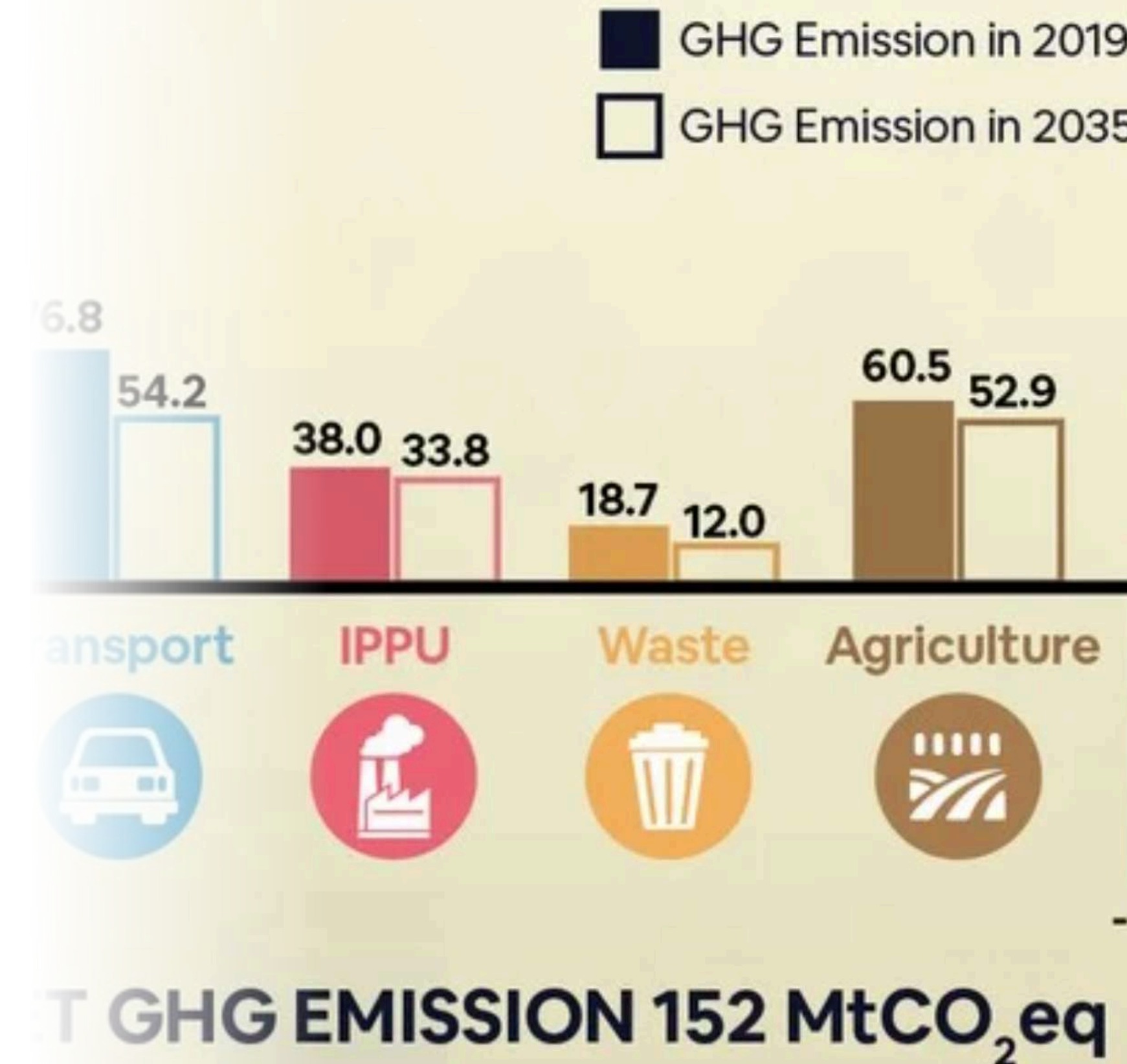
Thailand officially announced its commitment to **achieving net-zero greenhouse gas emissions by 2050** at COP30 on 19 November 2025.

Thailand also pledged to reduce its greenhouse gas emissions **by 47% by 2035**.

Thailand also remains committed to its goal of **achieving carbon neutrality by 2050**.

NDC 3.0 GHG emission reduction in the 2019 baseline



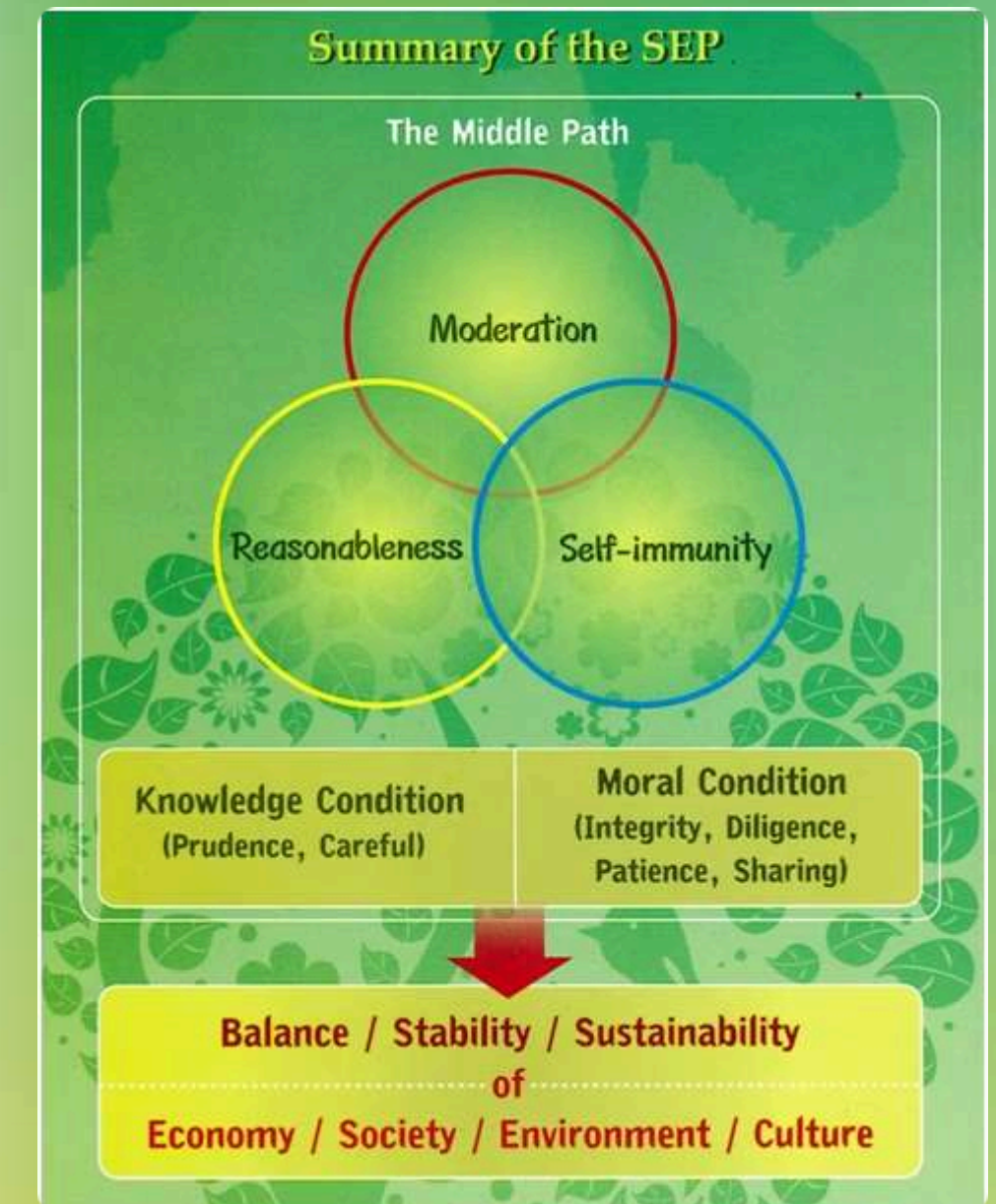
SEP with SDGs

UN Agencies

Hosts several UN agencies, including the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP) in Bangkok.



International Organizations

Over 30 international organizations, such as FAO, ICAO, UNAIDS, UNDP, UNESCO, UNHCR, UNICEF, and UNODC, operate in Thailand.



Thailand as Host of the 2026 Annual Meetings

Thailand is honored to host **the 2026 IMF–World Bank Annual Meetings**, reaffirming its commitment to multilateral cooperation and sustainable development.

The Meetings will take place from **12–18 October 2026** and mark **Thailand's second time hosting**, following its first hosting in 1991.

As a leading economy in Southeast Asia, Thailand provides **a strategic platform** for dialogue on global economic and financial issues.

Designed by Thai designer **Paitoon Patisonticharoen**, the logo is inspired by **the Phoduang (ancient Thai bullet coin)**. The logo also symbolizes endless financial growth, global economic cooperation, and Thailand's welcoming hospitality.
