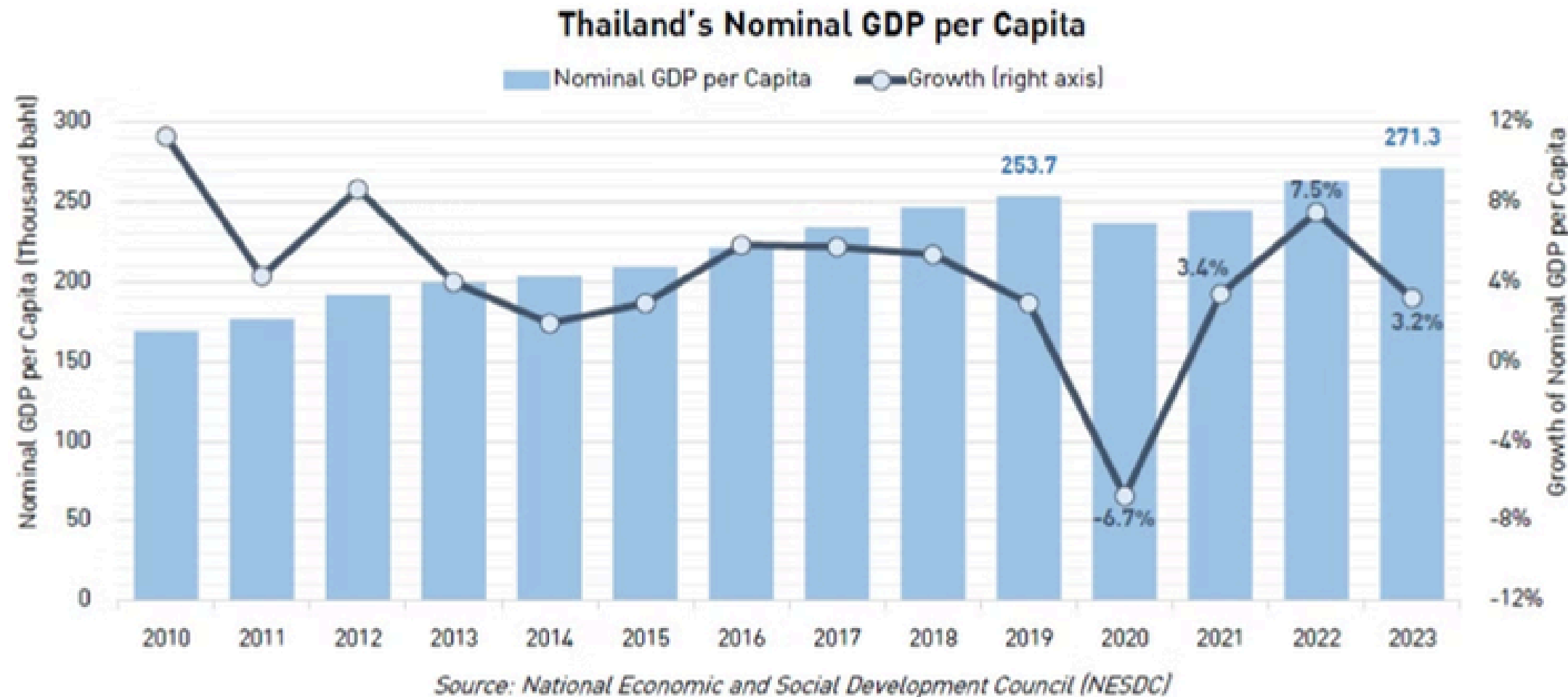


Thailand's Economic Performance

Thailand is the second largest economy in Southeast Asia after Indonesia, in terms of nominal GDP (gross domestic product) value. However, its nominal per capita is higher than that of Indonesia.

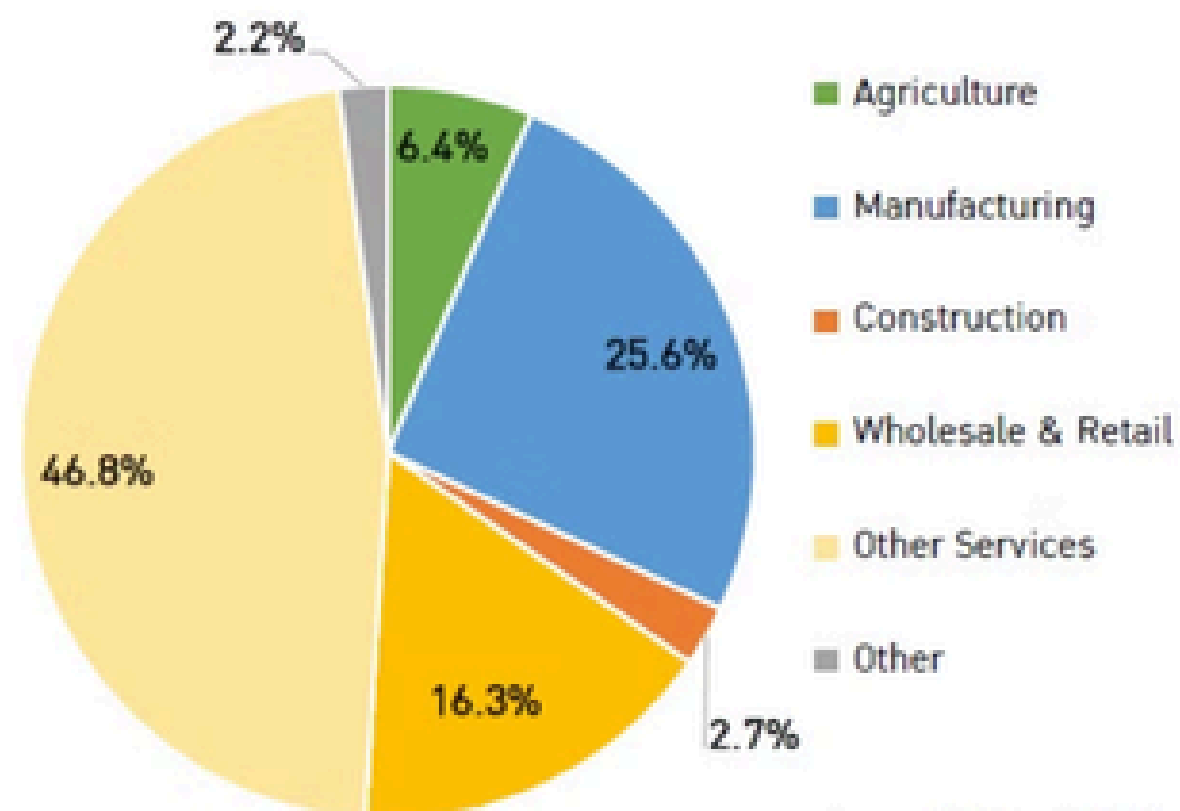

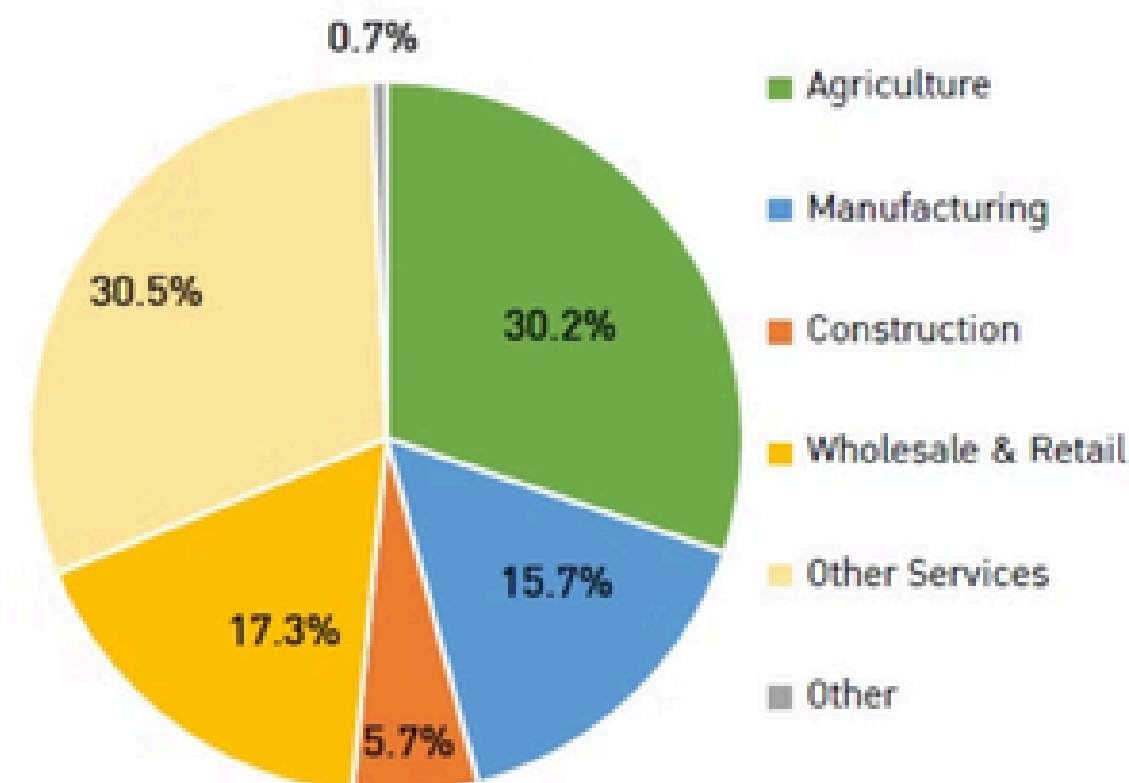
GDP = Agriculture + Manufacturing + Services + Other

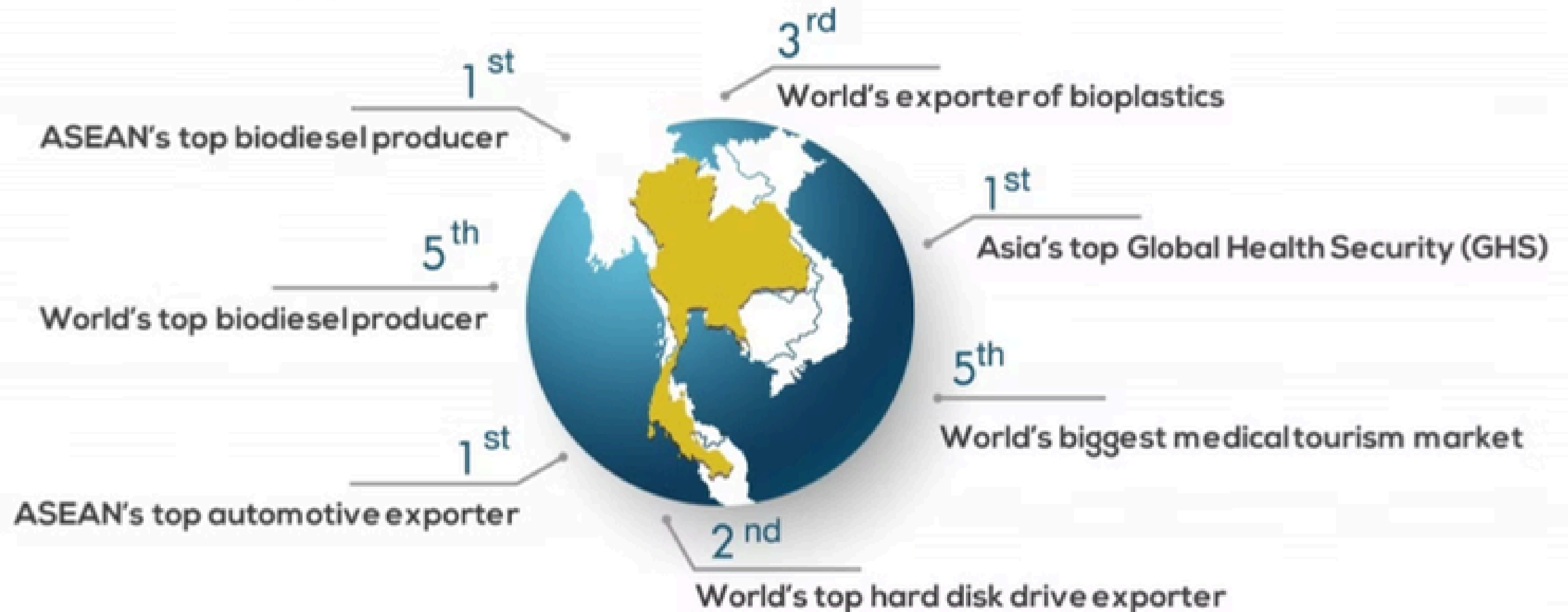

Thailand ranked Top 25 of the World in the 2026 FDI Index

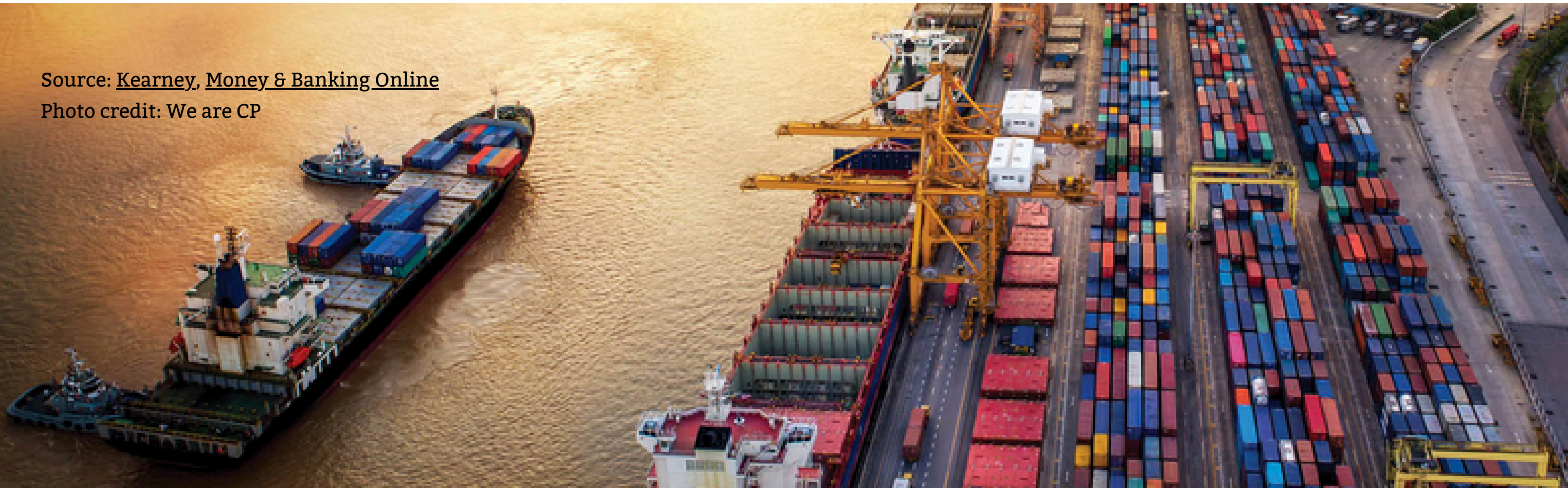
The 2026 Foreign Direct Investment (FDICI) index survey by Kearney

It reflects a recovery in confidence among senior executives worldwide amidst structural changes in global supply chains.

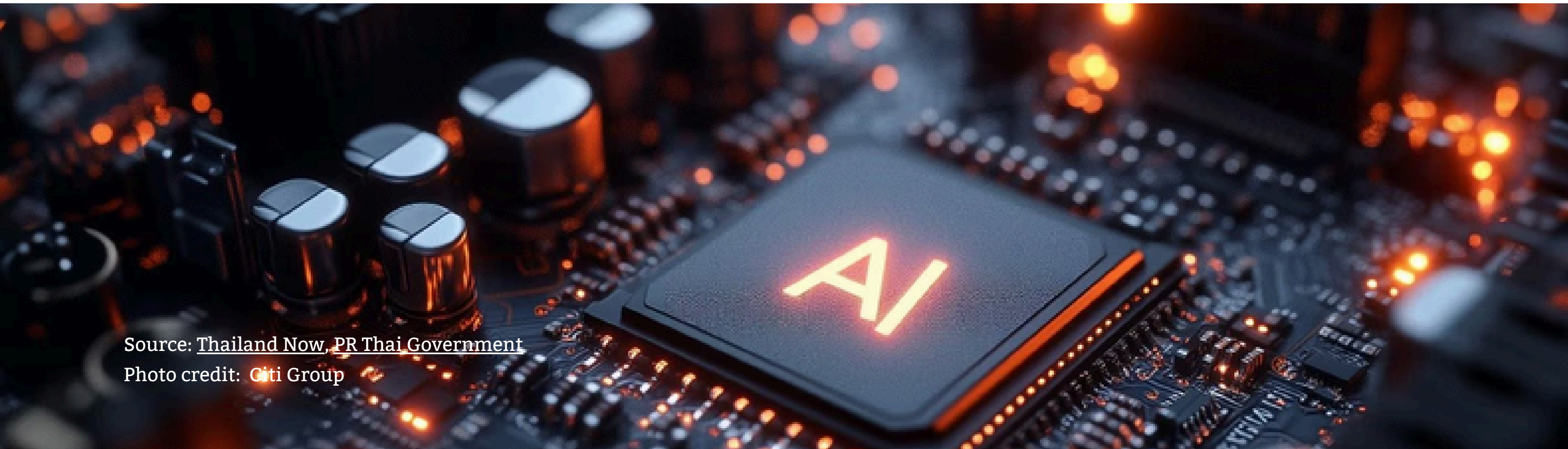
